Cinnamon Ornaments

1 part cinnamon

1 part applesauce

splash of nutmeg

Mix ingredients until it is a firm dough.

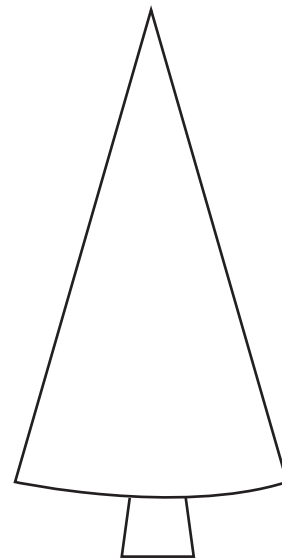
If too dry and crumbly, add more applesauce. If too moist, add more cinnamon or nutmeg.

Roll out on dry surface.

Use Yule cookie cutters to make your ornament shapes.

Add hole for ribbon and set aside until dry. They may take a few days to a week to dry.

You can also make tiny balls with this recipe to use in scented sachets.



Painted Rocks

Smooth rocks with two flat or slightly rounded sides.

Paint - Acrylic works well.

Tempera paint is good for children to use.

Old toothbrush.

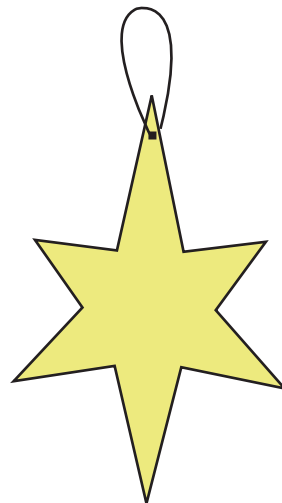
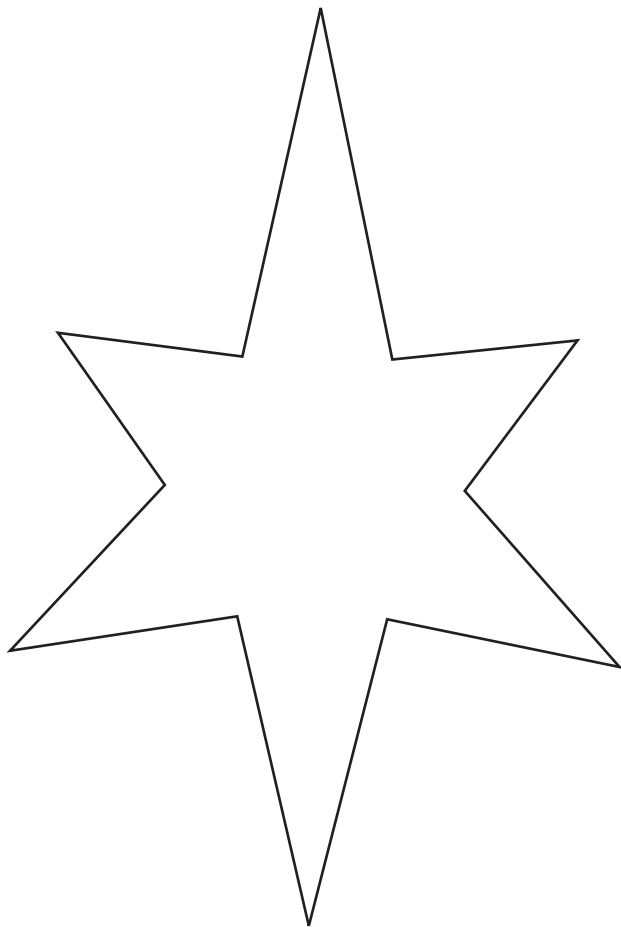
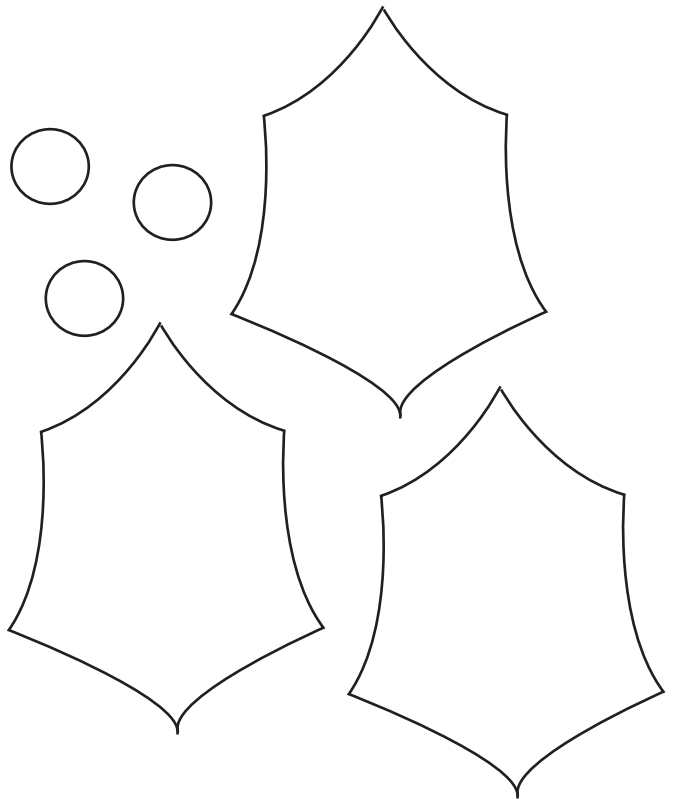
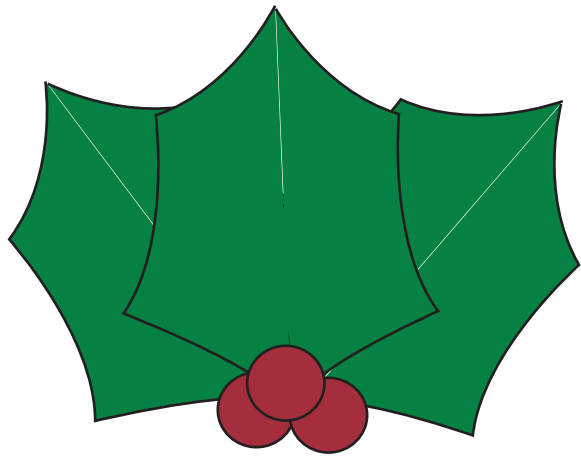
Clean rocks with old toothbrush and warm soapy water.

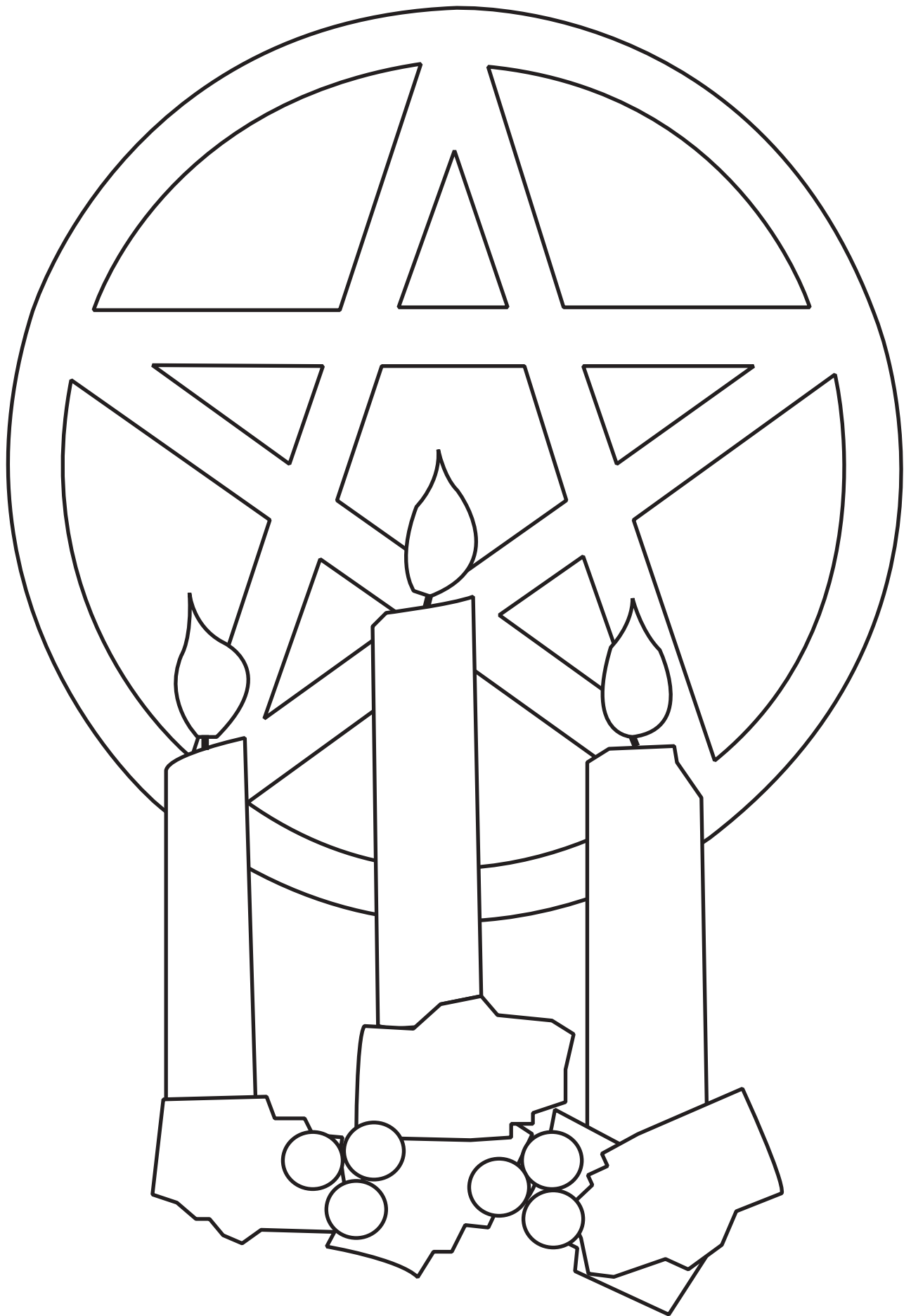
Allow to dry.

Paint Yule scenes, snowmen, snowflakes, slogans, etc., on one side of the rocks.

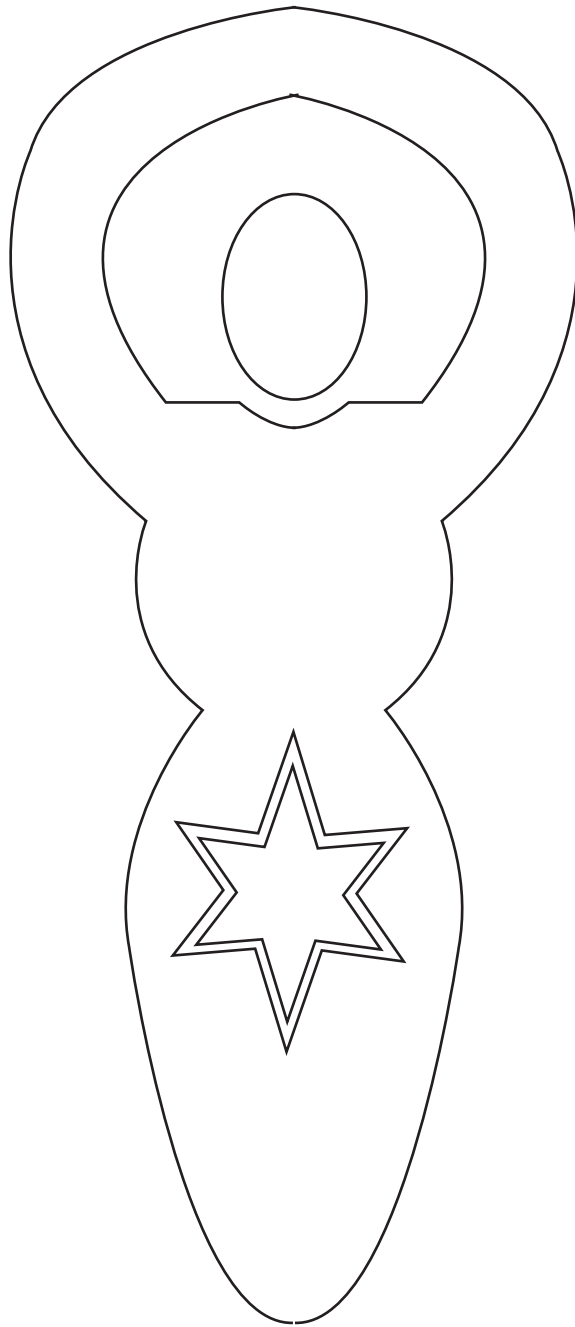
Allow to dry.

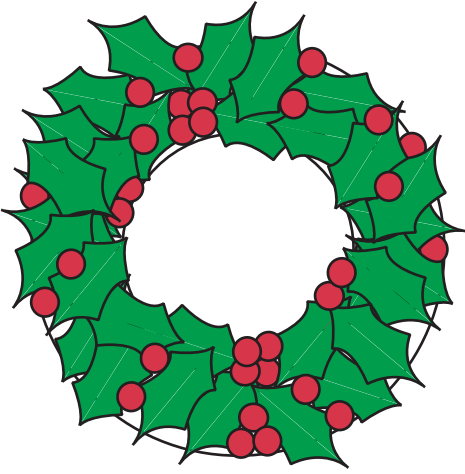
